October 3, 2026 - Your Journey Begins in Historic Boston!

Today you'll board your flight bound for **Boston!** Upon arrival, you'll be met and assisted with your transfer to your hotel in the heart of **America's first great city**, where history truly does come to life. Among the many iconic landmarks well worth visiting are **Bunker Hill Monument, Paul Revere's House, the Old North Church, Faneuil Hall** and the mansions of **Beacon Hill**. And don't forget that your hotel is happily situated directly across from the famed **Quincy Market!** You might also enjoy wandering through **Boston Common**, the oldest public park in the U.S. This evening you can relax and unwind, or perhaps explore downtown Boston a bit, enjoying dinner on your own.

October 4, 2026 - Sail Away from Boston on the Breakaway!

This morning, you'll check out with some free time to grab a morning bite, prepare for your cruise boarding, or quite possibly you'll want to enjoy one last look around downtown Boston. Later this morning, you'll transfer to your floating hotel for the next 7 nights, the **Norwegian Breakaway**, in time for a late lunch. This afternoon is the perfect time to stroll around the public decks and start getting to know your ship - and also be sure to be on deck for your **4pm sail-away!** Enjoy dinner tonight in one of the Breakaway's many fine restaurants, and don't forget to take in Norwegian's excellent entertainment options! October 5, 2026 - At Sea

As you sail north from Boston toward Maine, today is your first full one relaxing at sea, and discovering why the **Breakaway** is such a joy to treasure! When it's time to dine, the Breakaway offers you no less than **15 delightfully varied dining options** from poolside casual to high-end sophistication, including mouthwatering **Cagney's Steakhouse, Ocean Blue's** fresh local seafood, and French bistro-style cuisine at **Le Bistro!** For musical fun there's **Syd Norman's Pour**

House featuring the sounds of classic rock, and the dazzling dance show **Burn the Floor**. Theatrically speaking, you might also attend the Breakaway's Broadway-style musical **The Broadway Series: 80's Edition**, or jump start the evening at **Howl at the Moon**, the world's greatest rock 'n' roll dueling piano show or perhaps catch talented stand-up comedians delivering plenty of laughs at **Headliners Comedy Club**. October 6, 2026 - Portland, Maine

Today you'll be in **Portland** from **8am until 5pm**. **Maine's largest city** may not seem big to some, but it has all the offerings of a vibrant metropolis. The city's dedication to the arts, revered dining scene, and incredible preservation and reinvention of its historic sites continually impress. The **Old Port waterfront** features working fishing wharves and converted warehouses with restaurants and shops. Nearby, the **Western Promenade** is a public park atop a bluff, offering river and mountain views. Its surrounding district, the West End, is full of Victorian-era homes, including the **Victoria Mansion Museum**. You'll also find secluded beaches along island shorelines, centuries-old lighthouses perfectly perched atop coastal bluffs - and of course those **mouthwatering lobster rolls!** (B/L/D)

October 7, 2026 - Bar Harbor, Maine

Bar Harbor is celebrated for its stunning coastal beauty, lobster boats and spectacular vistas. You'll be here from **8am to 5pm** so make the most of your time! Nearby **Acadia National Park** is a gorgeous treasure with views from **Cadillac Mountain** that are never-ending. Vice President Nelson Rockefeller was born in Bar Harbor in 1908, and the community has long been a summer retreat for the rich and famous. You won't find a Starbucks or McDonald's here, but you will find quirky shops and cafes sporting names like **Cool as a Moose** and **Carmen Verandah!** It's a great place to stroll, shop, linger and feel the cool breeze of the Atlantic - perhaps enjoy a **blueberry beer** and some **world-famous Maine lobster!** (B/L/D)

October 8, 2026 - Saint John, New Brunswick

Today you'll be in Saint John from **8am to 4pm**. Here you'll find the **Bay of Fundy**, home to some of North America's **most striking and iconic shoreline scenery**, as well as the highest tides in the world. View the famous **Reversing Rapids** as the tides actually force the waters at the mouth of the **Saint John River** to reverse flow. The water level rises and falls by as much as 48 feet every day, as 100 billion tons of seawater crash into shore. Saint John itself is the oldest incorporated city in Canada, and a walk through the charming streets of Uptown brings hundreds of years of history alive. Don't miss the **Saint John City Market**, oldest continuous farmers' market in North America with rafters that resemble the inverted hull of a ship. (B/L/D)

October 9, 2026 - Halifax, Nova Scotia

You'll dock in **Halifax** this morning at **10am**. A popular excursion is always **Peggy's Cove**, founded in 1811 by six families of German descent. This quaint fishing village is a photographer's delight. Its **classic red and white lighthouse** is one of the most recognizable in the world. After snapping that perfect picture, be sure to visit some of the small, locally owned gift stores, galleries and craft shops. Featuring Canadian and Nova Scotian artists and craftspeople, you'll find charming gifts for friends and family. In **Halifax**, there's so much to see! Perched on a hill high above the city is the **Citadel National Historic Site**. The distinctive star shape is typical of many 19th-century British built forts.

It's easy to see why no enemy force dared to attack the Halifax Citadel. Today, its role is as a reminder of Halifax's past and not as a military fortification. An excursion to **Fairview Cemetery**, best known as the final resting place of 120 victims of the **Titanic** is popular as well. With so much to see, keep an eye on the clock and be sure to return in time for your **8pm** sailing. (B/L/D)

October 10, 2026 - At Sea

After several days of delightful sightseeing, you'll have this one to unwind and enjoy the many delicious tastes, entertainment and activities of the **Norwegian Breakaway!** You might check out the amazing **Aqua Park** with its five multi-story waterslides, two swimming pools, and four hot tubs. Or maybe test your luck in the Casino, or relax in pampered style at **Mandara Spa** with its soothing **Thermal Suite**. To satisfy any hunger or thirst, the casual **O'Sheehan's** offers classic pub fare all day with favorite comfort foods and a wide variety of beers, as you catch a game on their two-story TV screen. Fine worldwide cuisines may further tempt you with Italian at **La Cucina**, Japanese hibachi at **Teppanyaki**, or the Brazilian steakhouse **Moderno Churrascaria**. (B/L/D)
