Use Cards Wisely

- 2. Select the card you'll be using.
- 3. Tap Manage Travel Plan.
- 4. Tap Add Travel Plan, enter your travel details, and tap Submit.

You can add up to 2 Travel Plans per card and 15 destinations per Travel Plan!

Avoid Common Travel Scams

Carry only the cards you need. Leave extra checkbooks or IDs at home.

Store copies of important documents (like your ID, health insurance card, and travel itinerary) in a separate bag or digitally in a secure app.

Use a secure wallet or travel bag. Keep it close to your body in busy areas.
